Cooperation with the priority program "Gezähnte Geschichte

The universities in Erfurt, Darmstadt and Wuppertal cooperate with the BDPH within the framework of a joint research focus "Gezähnte Geschichte" (Toothed History). The role of the stamp itself as well as that of post and postal history in its interplay with historical science is being investigated. Originally, a conference on this topic was planned for autumn 2020 in Erfurt. Due to the lockdown, a joint event has now been planned. Therefore, in February and March 2021 there will be lecture dates where researchers from various German universities and experienced philatelists will present their work. By moving into virtual space, this is an ideal opportunity for philatelists to get a taste of a little research air.

Unfortunately, not all dates were fixed at the time of going to press for this issue. However, the topics are exciting and widely spread. Among others, there are lectures on the following topics:

Debtor or cash cow? The Federal Post Office as a Special Asset of the Federal Government, 1960s to 1980s

The Stamps of the Baltic States of the Interwar Period: Testimonies of National Origin or Baltic Commonality?

Where is Germany? On the Conveying of Political World Views on Stamps from the GDR

For all those who are still skeptical or those who have heard any rumors about the platform "ZOOM": ZOOM is now used worldwide for philatelic online seminars. The FIP relies on ZOOM just as much as the Royal Philatelic Society or the associations in the USA or India. During the lockdown period, several hundred philatelic lectures and seminars have so far gone through cleanly. The creators of the BDPH Seminare Online have coordinated their efforts with well-known experts and government agencies in the field of data protection. Nobody has to be afraid or have reservations about participating. There are also no costs or licenses. The necessary licenses are provided by the BDPH.
